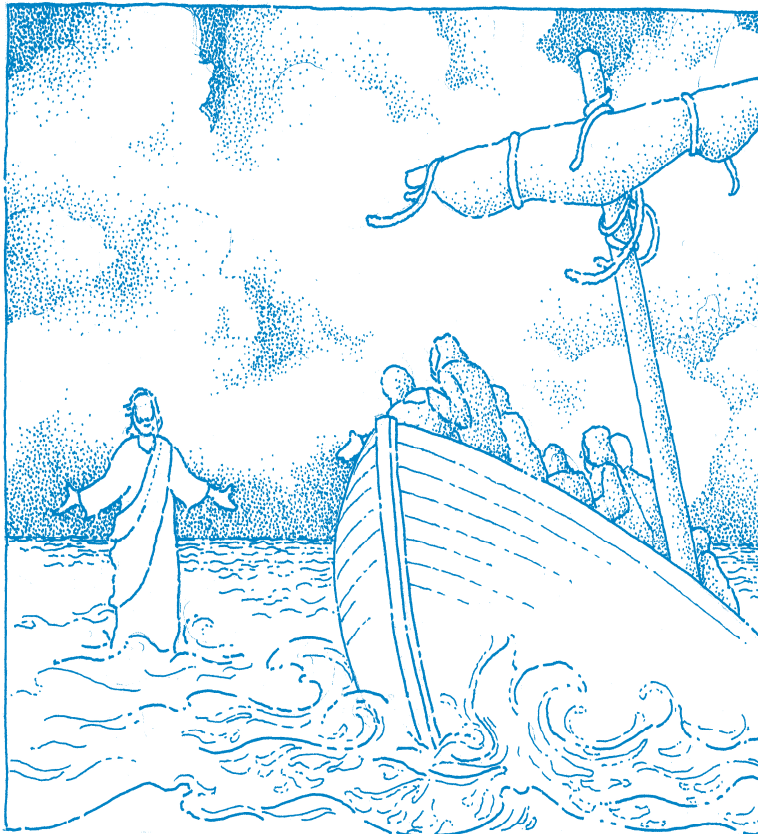

### **ASSUMPTION OF OUR LADY TO HEAVEN.**

In Pius XII's dogmatic statement, the phrase "having completed the course of her earthly life," leaves open the question of whether the Virgin Mary died before her assumption or whether she was assumed before death; both possibilities are allowed. Mary's assumption is said to have been a divine gift to her as the 'Mother of God'. Ludwig Ott's view is that, as Mary completed her life as a shining example to the human race, the perspective of the gift of assumption is offered to the whole human race. He states that "the fact of her death is almost generally accepted by the Fathers and Theologians, and is expressly affirmed in the Liturgy of the Church", and concludes that "for Mary, death, in consequence of her freedom from original sin and from personal sin, was not a consequence of punishment of

sin. However, it seems fitting that Mary's body, which was by nature mortal, should be, in conformity with that of her Divine Son, subject to the general law of death". The point of her bodily death has not been infallibly defined, and many believe that she did not die at all, but was

assumed directly into Heaven.

#### **OUR CHURCH RENOVATION PROJECT**

Dear Parishioners and Guests,



In 2019, Our Lady of Ostrabrama Church will mark its 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary. Over time, each generation has built on the strong foundations established in those early years of our church.

Thanks to the generosity of our parish community, we have been very fortunate to accomplish many significant capital projects throughout our history. We now look ahead to do what is necessary to respond to the needs of our parish. Our Lady of Ostrabrama Church would like to begin a construction project to ensure access into and use of the church and restrooms for all parishioners and visitors. Our plans include: installation of an elevator with a vestibule and, possibly, a glass enclosure; renovations of the restrooms, including making them handicap accessible; and repair of the drains in the church parking lot. The elevator will provide entry into the church and into the church hall from the parking lot level. The estimated cost of this project is \$200,000. To guarantee its successful completion, the church is asking for your financial help. We realize that raising \$200,000 will take a concentrated effort on the part of the entire community. As parishioners, you must decide what amount is appropriate to contribute, because the financial obligations of each family are different. Thank you in advance for your support of this project and our parish.
