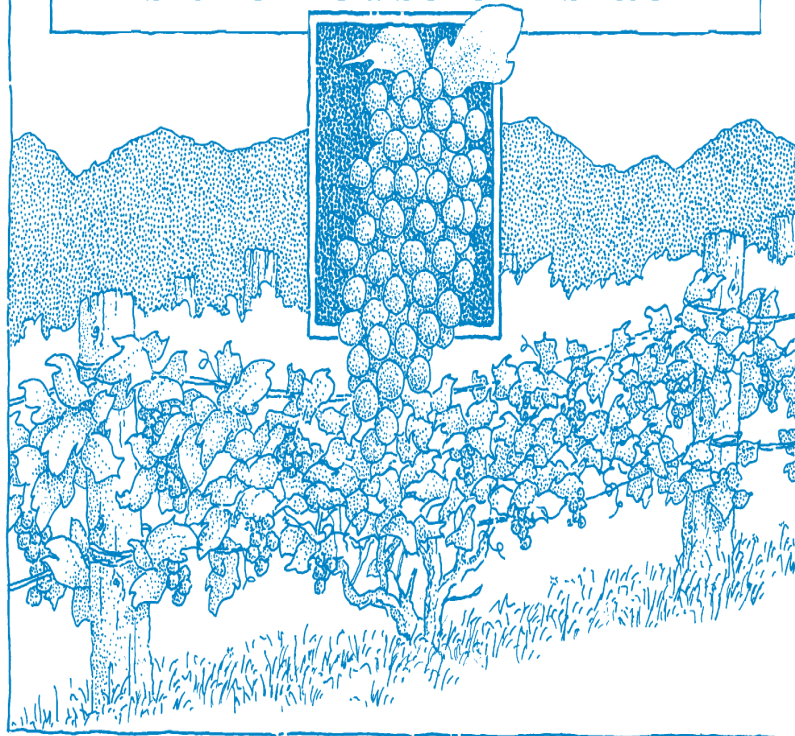
**PARISH REGISTRATION:** All families should be registered in the Parish. A census card may be obtained in the church entrance. If you are moving, please notify the Rectory.

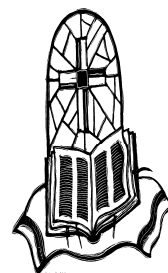

### **Cisza: pokarm duchowego organizmu**

Zachowanie ciszy i milczenia może być wyrazem naszej miłości do Boga. Nie ma autentycznej relacji z Bogiem i modlitwy bez ciszy i milczenia. Są one także sposobem okazywania miłości do siebie samego, bo wtedy możemy bez udawania spotkać siebie w prawdzie. W końcu milczenie staje się sposobem miłowania innych, gdyż praktykowanie go uczy powstrzymywania się od ranienia, drażnienia, narzekania, krytykanctwa itd. W ten sposób u Ojców Pustyni zewnętrzna cisza pogłębiona wewnętrznym milczeniem stawała się drogą nawrócenia, a porzucenie słów uwalniało od siebie i od świata. Milczenie było środkiem w walce o czystość serca i pokorę. W kontekście wiary cisza i milczenie nie są metodą odprężania się, sposobem zagłębiania się w siebie, rodzajem odcięcia się od świata. Są praktykowaniem nawrócenia i formowaniem istotnych postaw wobec Boga.

#### **Cicha modlitwa**

Ciszę pielęgnują różne metody modlitwy prostoty. Używają one jednego biblijnego słowa lub krótkiego zdania wypowiedzanego wewnętrznym, rytmicznym, bez zagłębiania się w jego znaczenie. W istocie są to różnorodne sposoby dbania o głęboką ciszę w sercu, ciszę przemieniającą, w której wzrasta cały człowiek. Aby praktykować modlitwę prostoty, potrzebna jest łaska. Objawia się ona jako tęsknota za ciszą, bezpośredniością i prostotą w modlitwie, jako pragnienie trwania w uświęcającej Obecności. Do modlitwy prostoty siada się z wiarą w cichą obecność Boga, z wiarą w rzeczywistość sakramentów chrztu i bierzmowania. One ukształtowały w nas **organizm duchowy**, którego nie da się karmić słowami i pojęciami, ale właśnie cichym przebywaniem w Tajemnicach. Gdy Abba Arseniusz prosił: „Panie, zaprowadź mnie na drogę zbawienia”, usłyszał: Fuge, tace, quiesce: wycofaj się, bądź cichy i spokojny ... i módl się. Wtedy, jak mówi abba Sisoës, Peregrinatio est tacere: milczenie staje się pielgrzymką. Pielgrzymką po Tajemnicach wiary. *Jacek Poznański SJ*
