
Easter 2015

Dear Brothers and Sisters in the Risen Lord: How changed is the world this Easter morn! How wondrous the truth on the lips of His faithful disciples! The world needs the witness of our faith in the Risen Christ. The world needs the witness of our hope for the future. The world needs our love that embraces all those whom our Savior embraced from the cross. May they too share in the resurrection of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! For He is Risen. He is truly risen. Alleluia!
