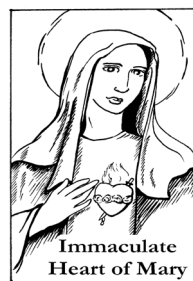
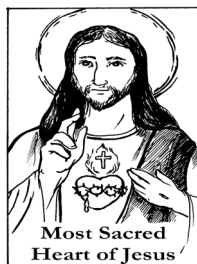

Homily for the the Solemnity of Corpus Christi - the Body and Blood of Jesus

by Fr. Tommy Lane. All of us together form the Church. Who is the center or head of the Church? Jesus is the center. How is Jesus most present to us? In the Blessed Sacrament. Today's celebration of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ, is the feast of the very center and heart of our church, the center and heart of our faith, and the center and heart of parish, the center and heart of the lives of each of us, Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. I know that some find it difficult to believe that bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus. I can understand your doubts. We don't see any change in the bread or wine. There is no difference in the taste; the bread still tastes like bread and the wine still tastes like wine. It is going against logic to say that the bread and wine change into the Body and Blood of Jesus despite no change in appearance. With our intellect we can understand that God must be keeping the universe together, that God is the origin of everything, but reason will only take us so far. Then we need to add faith to our reason and intellect. As Paul says, in the Christian life we go by faith and not by sight (2 Cor 5:7). We need to be humble and open to God performing a miracle every day in this church, the miracle of the Eucharist. Can you be humble enough to add faith to your intellect and reason, to admit that intellect by itself does not provide all the answers, and that God can perform miracles every day making it possible for bread and wine to become the Body and Blood of Jesus while keeping the same appearance? Can you add faith to your intellect? When you submit to God you will not lose anything, you will gain everything. There is a beautiful chant, "Trust, surrender, believe, receive." Add faith to your reasoning and receive the love of God for you! The Eucharist is the gift of God's love for you. To help us believe, from time to time, God has allowed visible miracles of the Eucharist to occur, Eucharistic Miracles as we call them. (To be continued)

Swieto Najświętszego Ciała i Krwi Chrystusa Chleb życia wiecznego.

Uroczystość Bożego Ciała jest świętem uwielbienia i dziękczynienia za dar Eucharystii. W tym dniu chrześcijanie gromadzą się wokół ołtarza, aby kontemplować i adorować tajemnicę wiary, pamiątkę ofiary Chrystusa, przez którą przyniósł On wszystkim ludziom zbawienie. Doskonale znaczenie Eucharystii rozumieli pierwsi chrześcijanie, którzy zachęcali się wzajemnie do przyjmowania Komunii św. słowami: pojdźmy po życie, po moc, po miłość, po świętość! Jezus najpierw zstąpił z nieba na ziemię, żył przez 33 lata i nauczał o królestwie Bożym, a tuż przed swoją śmiercią krzyżową zostawił nam w swoim testamencie Najświętszy Sakrament. A kiedy zmartwychwstał i wstąpił do nieba, to jednocześnie



pozostał z nami, na ziemi – z Ciałem i Duszą: pod postacią chleba i wina. Czy jednak naprawdę w to wierzymy? Od braku wiary lub chwilowego zwątpienia nikt nie jest wolny. Świadczy o tym cud w Macerata we Włoszech. Rankiem 15 kwietnia 1356 r., pewien kapłan odprawiał Mszę św. w kościele benedyktynek. Podczas konsekracji dopuścił się on krótkiej chwili zwątpienia w realną obecność Chrystusa w Eucharystii, gdy nagle przy łamaniu Chleba, z Hostii popłynęła krew. Ręce mu zadrżały i krople krwi upadły na korporał pod kielichem. Po zakończeniu Mszy św. kapłan pośpieszył do biskupa, który nakazał splamiony korporał poddać kanonicznemu badaniu w katedrze. Cud ten został porównany do słynnego cudu w Bolsena z 1236r., który dał początek świętu Bożego Ciała. Komisja potwierdziła autentyczność cudu i korporał z plamami krwi został wystawiony do publicznej adoracji. Krwawe plamy wyraźnie widoczne na korporale, uznane są za Najświętszą Krew Zbawiciela. Relikwiarz zawierający cenny skarb przetrwał burzliwe koleje losu a jego zawartość do dziś czczona jest w kaplicy katedry Macerata – szczególnie w oktawie Bożego Ciała. Chrystus powiedział kiedyś do słuchających go ludzi, którzy mieli dokładnie takie same problemy jak my: „Ciało moje jest prawdziwym pokarmem, a Krew moja jest prawdziwym napojem”. A „jeśli kto spożywa ten chleb, będzie żył na wieki”. I wtedy byli tacy, którzy uwierzyli, jak również tacy, którzy odeszli do tzw. swoich spraw. I wśród nas są tacy, którzy przyjmą te słowa z wiarą; inni może się nad nimi zastanowią; a jeszcze inni pewnie odejdą i wrócą do siebie bez żadnej reakcji, jakby nic się nie stało.
