Homily for the the Solemnity of Corpus Christi - the Body and Blood of Jesus

Fr. Tommy Lane. (Continued) These are miracles that occurred during Mass when the bread changed into the form of flesh during the consecration and the wine changed into the form of blood during the consecration. Many such Eucharistic Miracles have occurred in various parts of the world and throughout the two millennia of Christian history and have been authenticated by the Church. In the year 1263 a priest from Prague was on route to Rome making a pilgrimage asking God for help to strengthen his faith since he was having doubts about his vocation. Along the way he stopped in Bolsena 70 miles north of Rome. While celebrating Mass there, as he raised the host during the consecration, the bread turned into flesh and began to bleed. The drops of blood fell onto the small white cloth on the altar, called the corporal. The following year, 1264, Pope Urban IV instituted the feast of the Body and Blood of Jesus, today's feast, Corpus Christi. The Pope asked St Thomas Aquinas, living at that time, to write hymns for the feast and he wrote two, better known to the older members of our congregation, the Tantum Ergo and O Salutaris. That blood-stained corporal may still be seen in the Basilica of Orvieto north of Rome, and I had the privilege of seeing it during the time I lived in Italy. Although that is the eucharistic miracle that led to the institution of this feast, a more famous eucharistic miracle is the eucharistic miracle of Lanciano, also in Italy, which took place many centuries earlier, in the year 700. A monk who feared he was losing his vocation was celebrating Mass, and during the consecration the host turned into flesh and the wine turned into blood. Despite the fact that the miracle took place almost 1300 years ago, you may still see the flesh in a monstrance which is exposed every day and the blood in a glass chalice. (t.b.c.)

Najświętsze Serce Pana Jezusa. W maju modliliśmy się szczególnie do Matki Bożej, biorąc udział w Nabożeństwach Majowych. Czerwiec zaś to miesiąc w sposób szczególnie poświęcony czci Najświętszego Serca Pana Jezusa. Serca, z którego wypływa do nas Najczystsza Miłość i Dobroć, Prawda i Łaski. Kult Serca Jezusowego wywodzi się z czasów średniowiecza; początkowo miał charakter prywatny, z czasem ogarnął szerokie rzesze społeczeństwa. Od XVII wieku nabożeństwo do Serca Pana Jezusa staje się własnością ogółu wiernych i całego Kościoła. Za sprawą objawień św. Małgorzaty Marii Alacoque (1647 -1690) dotarły do nas obietnice Jezusa Chrystusa, złożone Małgorzacie w czasie nawiedzenia Najświętszego Sakramentu, gdy klęczała przed tabernakulum. Co nam ofiaruje Chrystus, w zamian za Adorację Jego Serca?

- Dam im łaski, potrzebne w ich stanie.
- Ustalę pokój w ich rodzinach.
- Będę ich pocieszał w utrapieniach.
- Będę ich pewną ucieczką w życiu, a szczególnie w godzinę śmierci.
- Będę im błogosławił w ich przedsięwzięciach.
- Grzesznicy znajdą w mym Sercu źródło i ocean miłosierdzia.
- Dusze oziębłe staną się gorliwymi.
- Dusze gorliwe prędko dojdą do doskonałości.
- Będę błogosławił domom, w których wizerunek Serca mojego będzie czczony.
- Osoby, które będą to nabożeństwo rozszerzały, będą miały imię swoje wypisane w Sercu moim.
- Dam kapłanom dar wzruszania serc nawet najzatwardziały.
- W nadmiarze miłosierdzia Serca mojego przyrzekam tym wszystkim, którzy będą komunikować w pierwsze piątki miesiąca przez dziewięć miesięcy z rzędu w intencji wynagrodzenia, że miłość moja udzieli łaskę pokuty, iż nie umrą w mojej niełasce, ani bez Sakramentów świętych, a Serce moje będzie im pewną ucieczką w ostatniej godzinie życia. Kościół, a więc i my, ma w nabożeństwie do Serca Jezusowego ujrzeć znak miłości Boga ku ludziom. To przecież z miłości Serca Jezusa powstał Kościół, Sakramenty święte, a wśród nich Największy Sakrament Miłości – Eucharystia. cdn
