Rosary in community we pray before daily Mass and in

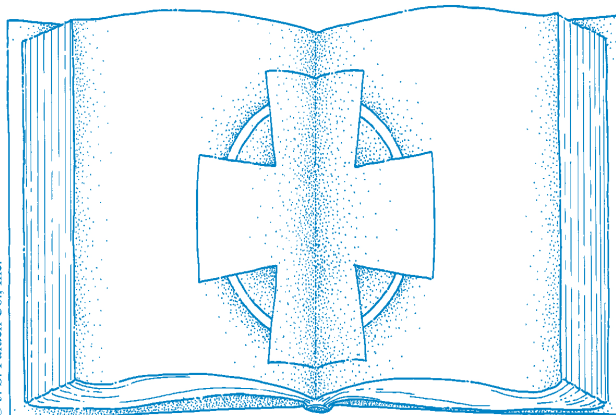

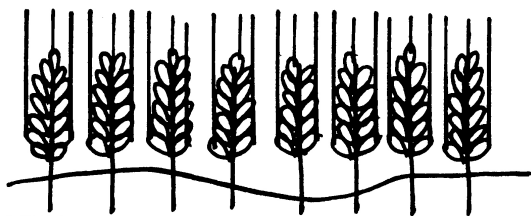
Sakramentalna ofiara, dziękczynienie, pamiętka, obecność

Chrześcijanie od początku celebrują Eucharystię, a jej forma w swej istocie nie zmieniła się w ciągu wieków i w rozmaitych liturgiach. Wynika to z tego, że jest dla nas wiążące polecenie Pana, który w wigilię swojej męki powiedział: "Czyńcie to na moją pamiętkę!".

Wypełniamy to polecenie, celebrując pamiętkę Jego ofiary. Ofiarujemy w niej Ojcu to, co On sam nam dał: dary Jego stworzenia, chleb i wino, które mocą Ducha Świętego i słów Chrystusa stają się Jego Ciałem i Krwią. W ten sposób Chrystus uobecnia się rzeczywiście, chociaż w sposób tajemniczy.

Eucharystię powinniśmy więc pojmować:

- jako dziękczynienie i uwielbienie Ojca;
- jako pamiętkę ofiary Chrystusa i Jego Ciała;
- jako obecność Chrystusa dzięki mocy Jego słowa i Jego Ducha.

The Sacramental Sacrifice Thanksgiving, Memorial, Presence

If from the beginning Christians have celebrated the Eucharist and in a form whose substance has not changed despite the great diversity of times and liturgies, it is because we know ourselves to be bound by the command the Lord gave on the eve of his Passion: "Do this in remembrance of me."

We carry out this command of the Lord by celebrating the memorial of his sacrifice. In so doing, we offer to the Father what he has himself given us: the gifts of his creation, bread and wine which, by the power of the Holy Spirit and by the words of Christ, have become the body and blood of Christ. Christ is thus really and mysteriously made present.

We must therefore consider the Eucharist as: - thanksgiving and praise to the Father;
- the sacrificial memorial of Christ and his Body;

- the presence of Christ by the power of his word and of his Spirit.
