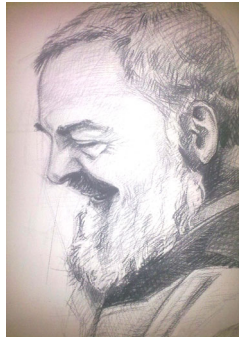
Annual Pig Roast

Pamiętka ofiary Chrystusa i Jego Ciała, Kościoła

Ponieważ Eucharystia jest pamiętką Paschy Chrystusa, jest ona także ofiarą. Charakter ofiarny ukazuje się już w słowach jej ustanowienia: "To jest Ciało moje, które za was będzie wydane" i "Ten kielich to Nowe Przymierze we Krwi mojej, która za was będzie wylana". W Eucharystii Chrystus daje to samo ciało, które wydał za nas na krzyżu, tę samą krew, którą wylał "za wielu... na odpuszczenie grzechów".

Eucharystia jest więc ofiarą, ponieważ u-obecnia (czylni obecna) ofiarę krzyża, jest jej pamiętką i udziela jej owoców:

(Chrystus), nasz Bóg i Pan, tylko raz ofiarował siebie Bogu Ojcu, umierając na ołtarzu krzyża, dla wypełnienia wiecznego odkupienia ludzi. Ponieważ jednak kapłaństwo nie miało skończyć się wraz z Jego śmiercią, w czasie Ostatniej Wieczerzy, "tej nocy, kiedy został wydany", zechciał pozostawić Kościołowi, swojej ukochanej Oblubienicy, ofiarę widzialną (według wymagań natury ludzkiej). Będzie ona reprezentowała ofiarę krwawą, która miała wypełnić się jeden raz na krzyżu, i utrwalała jej pamiętkę po wszystkie wieki, a zbawcza moc będzie udzielała odpuszczenia grzechów, które codziennie popełniamy.

The Sacramental Sacrifice Thanksgiving, Memorial, Presence

Because it is the memorial of Christ's Passover, the Eucharist is also a sacrifice. the sacrificial character of the Eucharist is manifested in the very words of institution: "This is my body which is given for you" and "This cup which is poured out for you is the New Covenant in my blood." In the Eucharist Christ gives us the very body which he gave up for us on the cross, the very blood which he "poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins.

The Eucharist is thus a sacrifice because it re-presents (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross, because it is its memorial and because it applies its fruit:

[Christ], our Lord and God, was once and for all to offer himself to God the Father by his death on the altar of the cross, to accomplish there an everlasting redemption. But because his priesthood was not to end with his death, at the Last Supper "on the night when he was betrayed," [he wanted] to leave to his beloved spouse the Church a visible sacrifice (as the nature of man demands) by which the bloody sacrifice which he was to accomplish once for all on the cross would be re-presented, its memory perpetuated until the end of the world, and its salutary power be applied to the forgiveness of the sins we daily commit.
