PARISH REGISTRATION: A census card can be obtained in the church entrance or in the Rectory.

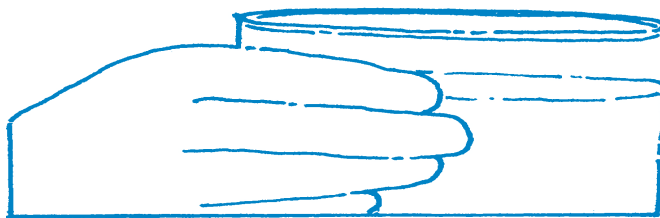

Pamiętka ofiary Chrystusa i Jego Ciała, Kościoła

Ciąg dalszy

Ofiara Chrystusa i ofiara Eucharystii są jedyną ofiarą. "Jedna i ta sama jest bowiem Hostia, ten sam ofiarujący - obecnie przez posługę kapłanów - który wówczas ofiarował siebie na krzyżu, a tylko sposób ofiarowania jest inny...". A skoro w tej Boskiej ofierze, dokonującej się we Mszy świętej, jest obecny i w sposób bezkrwawy ofiarowany ten sam Chrystus, który na ołtarzu krzyża ofiarował samego siebie w sposób krwawy, ofiara ta jest naprawdę prześlągalna".

Eucharystia jest również ofiarą Kościoła. Kościół, który jest Ciałem Chrystusa, uczestniczy w ofierze swojej Głowy. Razem z Chrystusem ofiaruje się cały i łączy się z Jego wstawieniem u Ojca za wszystkich ludzi. W Eucharystii ofiara Chrystusa staje się także ofiarą członków Jego Ciała. Życie wiernych, składane przez nich uwielbienie, ich cierpienia, modlitwy i praca łączą się z życiem, uwielbieniem, cierpieniami, modlitwami i pracą Chrystusa i z Jego ostatecznym ofiarowaniem się oraz nabierają w ten sposób nowej wartości. Ofiara Chrystusa obecna na ołtarzu daje wszystkim pokoleniom chrześcijan możliwość zjednoczenia się z Jego ofiarą.

Na malowidłach zachowanych w katakumbach Kościoła często jest przedstawiany jako kobieta na modlitwie, z szeroko otwartymi ramionami, w postawie "orantki". Podobnie jak Chrystus, który wyciągnął ramiona na krzyżu, Kościół ofiarowuje się i wstawia za wszystkich ludzi przez Niego, z Nim i w Nim.

The Sacramental Sacrifice Thanksgiving, Memorial, Presence (Continue)

The sacrifice of Christ and the sacrifice of the Eucharist are one single sacrifice: "The victim is one and the same: the same now offers through the ministry of priests, who then offered himself on the cross; only the manner of offering is different." "In this divine sacrifice which is celebrated in the Mass, the same Christ who offered himself once in a bloody manner on the altar of the cross is contained and is offered in an unbloody manner."

The Eucharist is also the sacrifice of the Church, the Church which is the Body of Christ participates in the offering of her Head. With him, she herself is offered whole and entire. She unites herself to his intercession with the Father for all men. In the Eucharist the sacrifice of Christ becomes also the sacrifice of the members of his Body, the lives of the faithful, their praise, sufferings, prayer, and work, are united with those of Christ and with his total offering, and so acquire a new value. Christ's sacrifice present on the altar makes it possible for all generations of Christians to be united with his offering.

In the catacombs the Church is often represented as a woman in prayer, arms outstretched in the praying position. Like Christ who stretched out his arms on the cross, through him, with him, and in him, she offers herself and intercedes for all men.
